AN ACT to enable Local Authorities to maintain, repair, and protect War Memorials.

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as 'The War Memorials (Local Authorities' Powers) Act, 1927'.

2 Definitions

In this Act the expression 'Local Authority' means (a) within the borough of Douglas, the Municipal Corporation of such borough; (b) elsewhere within this Isle, the Commissioners of any Local Government District.

3 War Memorial may be vested in local authority

Any War Memorial may be vested in the Local Authority of the District in which it is situate.

4 Local authority may keep War Memorial in repair

A local authority may incur reasonable expenditure in the provision, inscription, alteration, extension, renewal, maintenance, repair and protection of any War Memorial within their district or may contribute to the expenses of any local authority in the provision, inscription, alteration, extension, renewal, maintenance, repair and protection of any War Memorial in the Parish of which the district of such local authority forms part and may for such purpose, with the leave of the Department, borrow such capital sum as may be necessary for such purpose upon such terms and conditions as to interest and period of repayment as the Department may determine.¹

5 War Memorial Committee may transfer moneys to local authority

Where a Committee formed for the purpose of erecting a War Memorial or an Officer of such Committee has any moneys in hand after defraying the cost of the erection of such War Memorial, it shall be lawful for such Committee to pay over or to direct its officers having charge of such moneys to pay over the whole or any portion of such moneys to the Local Authority of the District in which such War Memorial is situate, and the moneys so paid over shall be applied by the Local Authority in the maintenance, repair, and protection of such War Memorial.

6 Commencement of Act

This Act shall come into force when the Royal Assent thereto has been by the Governor announced to Tynwald, and a certificate to this effect has been signed by the Governor and the Speaker of the House of Keys.
